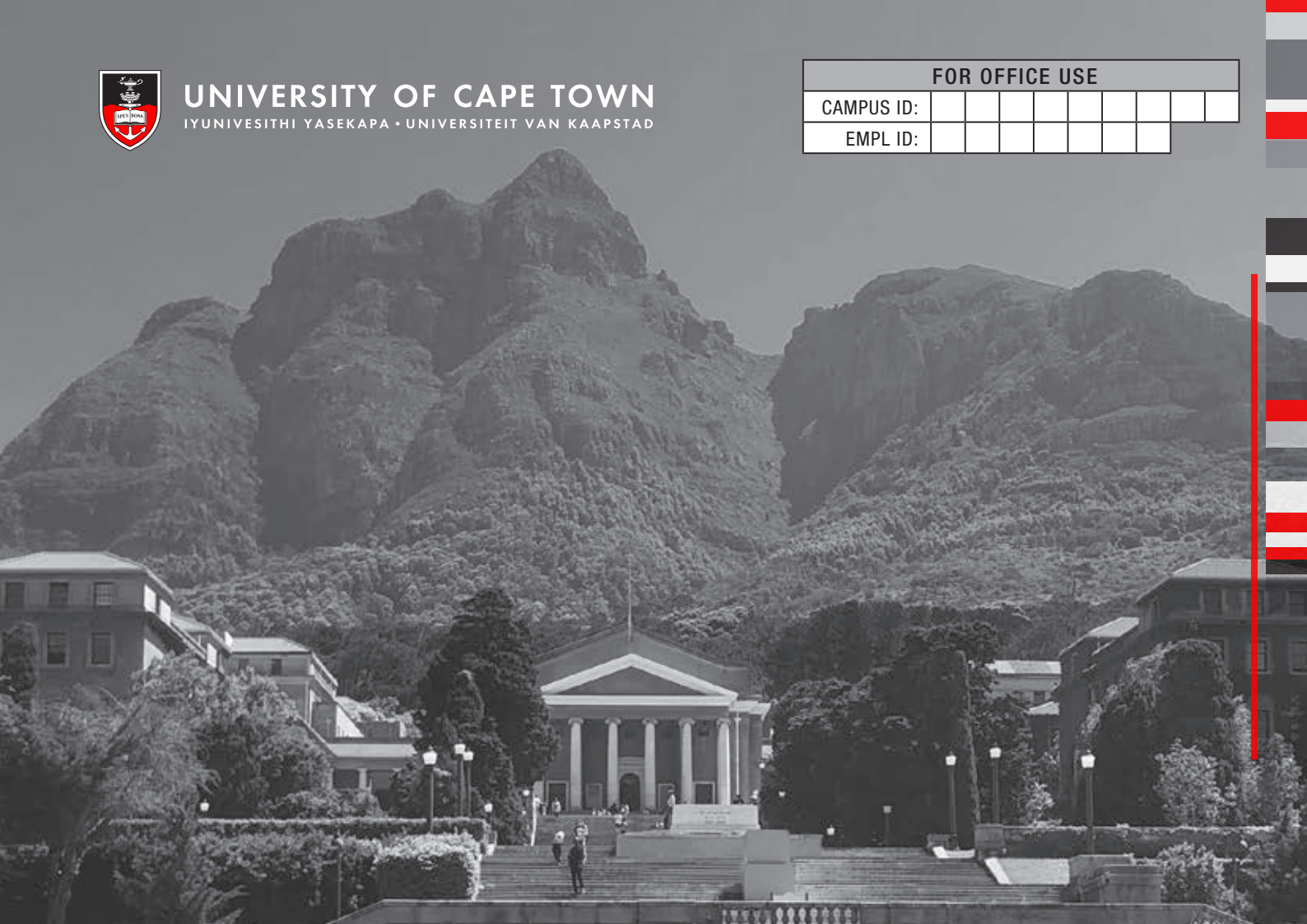

SECTION B

NATIONAL BENCHMARK TEST (NBT) NUMBER

All applicants to undergraduate programmes (with the exception of the Faculty of Engineering & the Built Environment which does not have a NBT requirement) normally resident, or at school, in South Africa, and all Health Sciences applicants, wherever resident, must write the NBTs. If you wish to be considered for a conditional offer by the Faculty of Health Sciences, you must write the NBTs by 31 August 2021. If you write the NBTs after 31 August, you will only be considered for an offer in early 2022 after your final examination results are received. The final date to write the NBTs for admission to UCT is 2 October 2021. If you are required to write the NBTs, you must register for NBTs before submitting this form. Enter your 14-digit NBT registration number and, if you wrote before 2021, the year the NBTs were written. NBT results are only valid for two years prior to the year of application; so if you wrote the NBTs in 2019 or 2020, the results remain valid but you may choose to rewrite in 2021.
